Teddy Hooded Jacket - Baby

YARN USAGE

3 months: 250 g

6 months: 300 g



Knitted in Go handmades Teddy - a luxurious yarn in the nicest colours. Soft like a dream: 100% Polyester, 50 g/65 m.

Duffle buttons
Knitting needle: 3,5 mm
Gauge: 17 sts/10 cm

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YARN USAGE

3 months: 250 g

6 months: 300 g

MATERIALS

Duffle Buttons

Knitting needle: 3,5 mm

Gauge: 17 sts = 10 cm

Specified yarn quantities are indicative

The use of a marker or counter is recommended due to the difficulty of identifying sts and rows with the Teddy yarn.

FINAL MEASUREMENTS

Circumference 52 (56) cm

Length 24 (28) cm

Sleeves length 15 (18) cm

ABBREVIATIONS AND DEFINITIONS

st(s)	Stitch(es)
N	Needle(s)
k	Knit
p	Purl
M1B	Increase: lift the loop between the sts from behind with the left needle and work it as a knit st.
k2tog	Decrease: knit 2 stitches together.
Button hole	Bind off 2 sts. Next round cast on 2 new sts above the bound off sts.
(..)	At the end of the line, specifies the number of sts on the needle/row for both sizes: 3 months (6 months)
* ... *	Repeat what is shown in these brackets to the end of the row, or as indicated.

Soft like a dream and a yarn many have been longing for, to be used for knitting and crocheting baby ware, teddies and blankets.

A "fluffy" yarn, that doesn't require any special techniques or stitches to get a nice and chunky result. Use Teddy for cuddle animals to give them a real "teddy" look or knit/crochet a blanket for babies/toddlers.

Teddy has been awarded the AZO certificate and is thus a yarn that everyone can feel safe wearing.

100% Polyester,
50 g/65 m.



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HOODED JACKET 3 MONTHS (6 MONTHS)

The jacket is worked from one sleeve to the other.

Loosely cast on 20 (24) sts on a 3,5 mm N.

Knit until 2 (2) cm high.

After 2 cm, increase on both sides M1B and repeat 5 (7) times, to a total of 30 (38) sts.

Knit until the sleeve length reaches 15 (18) cm.

At the start and the end of the N, cast on 20 (24) sts each, altogether 70 (76) m.

Knit until total length reaches 7 (8) cm.

Divide the work into front and back, equal number of sts.

Place a marker at the middle of the shoulder/work 35 (43) sts.

BACK

At the neckline bind off 1 (1) st and knit until a length of 13 (14) cm in the centre of the back.

Knit the second half identical to the first but cast on 1 (1) st at the neckline.

Set the work aside.

FRONT PIECE

Each 2nd row k2tog at the neckline, repeat 3 (3) times. Continue to knit until a length of 13 (14) cm.

Insert 4 (4) button holes at equal distances.

Knit until total length of 14,5 (15,5) cm.

Bind off.

For the second piece, cast on 32 (40) sts, knit until total length of 6 (7) cm.

At the end of each 2nd row M1B for the neckline, altogether 3 (3) times.

Knit front and back panels together and knit until pieces measures 14,5 (15,5) cm.

Bind off the same number of sts as were cast on after the first sleeve.

Knit sleeve identical to the first one but decreasing instead of increasing.

Bind off.

HOOD

Evenly pick up 50 (50) sts out of the neckline.

Knit 4 (4) cm. Increase 10 (10) sts evenly throughout the row.

For size 6 months only:

Increase another 10 sts when the length of 10 cm has been reached.

Both sizes:

Knit until the work measures 18 (20) cm.

Put sts onto two needles, and from the side with the ridges always k2tog and bind off at the same time, or bind off all sts and sew hood together.

EARS FOR THE HOOD (2 X)

Cast on 6 st.

1.)	p	(6)
2.)	*k1, M1B* x 5, k1	(11)
3. - 6.)	Stockinette st	(11)
7.)	k (bucking edge)	(11)
8. - 11.)	Stockinette st	(11)
12.)	k2tog x 5, k1	(6)

Cut the yarn, use a darning needle to pull the thread through the stitches, pull tight.

Fold the ear at the bucking edge and sew with a few stitches to hold it together.

ASSEMBLY

Sew sides and sleeves together.

Weave in ends and sew on buttons.

Good to know

Needle Size ≠ Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us.

The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.



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
