Vintage

- a wonderful wool yarn with bamboo

The bamboo adds softness and lightness to the yarn, and the wool contributes with its well-known excellent durability.

Wool is a sturdy material that requires very little washing and lasts for a very long time. It is one of the reasons why some consider wool to be among the most sustainable materials.

Vintage is perfect for crocheting and knitting small animals that you want to give a "woolen" look. It is also suitable for a nice sweater.

70% Wool, 30% Bamboo, 25 g/60 m.

YARN USAGE

3 months: 150 g 6 months: 150 g

MATERIALS

Duffle buttons

Knitting needles: 3,0 and 3,5 mm

Gauge: 26 sts/10 cm

The given amounts of yarn are for guidance only.

Cable for cardigan

r 1 p1, *k4, p1* r 2 k1, *p4, k1*

r 3 p1, *2 sts on aux N in front or work, k2, k the 2 sts from the aux N, p1*

r 4 same as r 1.

Button hole for cardigan

k2, bind off 2. In the following row, cast on 2. The button holes are worked from the right over the last 6 sts on the needle.

The 1st button hole after 4 "ridges", the following ones with an interval of 11 (13) "ridges".

Note: This cardigan is knitted top down. For a nicer edge of the button tape, it is possible to slip the first stitch purl wise with the thread in front of the work.

Row with holes yo, k2tog, p2 throughout the row.

Next row *yo, k1*.

Short rows After turning, start the row with a yo.

When getting back to yo at the end of rows, knit them together with the next

stitch.

Crab Stitch Crochet stitch for border finish. It is

worked from the left to the right. Insert the crochet hook through the stitch right from the needle and pull the thread through the stitch, resulting into

two loops on the needle. Pull the yarn through both loops.

f...* Repeat what is shown in these stars to the end of the row.

(..) At the end of the row, specifies the number of sts on the needle for both

sizes: 3 months (6 months).

CARDIGAN WITH ASYMMETRICAL BUTTON TAPE

3 MONTHS (6 MONTHS)

Cast on **70** (**76**) sts on KN 3,0 mm.
7 r k (4 "ridges" will appear on the right side of the work), and in the last row insert evenly **6** (**12**) increases.

Transfer onto KN 3,5 mm, stocking stitch with cables and raglan increases.

k6 (button tape),

M1B, k10 (12) (sleeve), M1B, p1, k4 (cable), p1, M1B, k12 (16) (back), M1B, p1, k4 (cable), p1, M1B, k8 (12) (sleeve), M1B, p1, k4 (cable), p1, M1B, k8 (12), M1B, p1, k4 (cable), p1 (front), k6. A total of 84 (96) sts on the KN.

On the wrong side knit as per diagram and purl all increases

In each other row (right side), knit increases. Continue with the increases and cables until 15 (18) increases have been worked in.

The work now measures 11 (12) cm, measured from the neck line

Divide the work into sleeves and back/front.

BACK/FRONT

Put the sts of the sleeves on a safety needle.

Knit the 6 sts of the button tape, cast on 8 sts under the sleeve, knit the sts of the back, cast on 8 sts under the sleeve, knit the sts of the front, knit the 6 sts of the button tape. A total of 132 (152) sts is on the KN.

Knit flat with cables on the sides until the work measures 23 (27) cm;

finish the work with a row on the right side. Work the last button hole before the 8 sts, which will be knitted with KN 3,0 mm. Bind off loosely.

SLEEVES

Knit the sleeves with double pointed needles.
Cast on 4 sts, k the sts of the sleeves, cast on 4 sts, for a total of **48** (**56**) sts on the needles.
Insert a marker in the centre under the sleeve.
Knit stocking stitch for **1,5** (**2**) cm and then decrease under the sleeve as follows: k1, k2tog.
Knit the last 3 sts of the row as follows: k2 tw tog, k1.
Repeat the decrease with 2 cm interval to a total of **5** (**7**) times. There are now **38** (**42**) sts on the KN.
Continue until the sleeve measures **13** (**16**) cm.
Transfer onto KN 3,0 mm and knit 8 r flat.
Bind off loosely. Work the second sleeve accordingly.

ASSEMBLY

Sew in ends, sew together under the sleeves and at the bottom of the sleeves. Sew buttons



- = Cable pattern: transfer the first 2 sts on an auxiliary N in front of the work, knit the next 2 sts, knit the 2 sts of the aux N

Good to know

Needle Size & Tension

Knitters knit very differently: some knit with a needle size 2,0 mm and obtain the same size of design quality as a person who knits with a needle size 4,0 mm. We owe this knowledge to the team of knitters who join us. The key to knit a specific size is a lot about the knitting style/hands/skills, rather than the size of needles.
