

1807 - Floating sweater with fisherman's rib stripes in Mayflower Super Kid Silk.

To achieve the best result, we recommend using Knit Pro needles, which is the professional tool for knitting and crochet.

The sweater is knitted in double yarn!

Pattern:

4 r/rnd ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1).

16 r/rnd in fisherman's rib.

Repeat these 20 r/rnd.

Fisherman's rib, knitted in the rounds (stitch amount divisible by 2):

- 1. rnd: * Knit the knit stitch, slip the purl stitch with purl wise, with the yarn over, repeat from *.
- 2. rnd: * slip the knit sts purl wise with yo, purl the purl sts together with the yo, repeat from *.
- 3. rnd: * Knit the knit sts together with the yo, slip the purl sts purl wise with yo.

Repeat 2nd and 3rd rnd.

Fisherman's rib, knitted back and forth (stitch amount divisible by 2):

- 1. r: * Knit the knit sts, slip the purl sts purl wise with yo, repeat from *.
- **2. r:** * Knit the knit sts together with the yo, slip the purl sts purl wise with yo. Repeat 2nd row.

Edge stitches (beaded selvedge): The first sts on all rows is slipped knit wise with the yarn behind the work, and the last sts is knitted.

Back and front.

Knitted together on circular needle up to the armholes. Cast on 148(156)160(168)172(180) sts with double yarn on circular needles US 8/UK 6 and knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1). When the edge measures 5 cm, continue on circular needles US 10 ½/UK 2 in pattern, starting with 16 rnds fisherman's rib. Work straight until the work measures 41(42)43(44)45(46) cm and split it by the beginning of the rnd and after 74(78)80(84)86 (90) sts for back and front piece.

Back.

Start by casting on 1 new edge sts in the left side = 75(79)81(85)87(91) sts and continue back and forth in pattern like before, within the edge sts in both sides. When the armhole measures 21(22)23(24) 25(26) cm, put all sts on a stitch holder. Put a marker on each side of the middle 27(29)29 (31)31(33) sts for the neck. The remaining 24(25)26(27)28 (29) sts in each side are shoulder sts.

Front.

Knitted like the back, but with a deeper neckline: When the armhole measures 16(17)18(19)20 (21) cm, put the middle 7(9)9(11)11(13) sts on a stitch holder for the neckline and finish each side apart. In the neck side on every other row, fasten off another 1 x 4 sts, 1 x 3 sts, 1 x 2 sts and 1 x 1 sts. When the armhole measures 21(22)23(24)25 (26) cm, knit the shoulder together with the corresponding shoulder on the back: put the needles with the shoulder sts together knit wise, and knit the stitches together in knit sts with 1 sts from each needle. Fasten off at the same time. Knit the other side mirrored.

Sleeve.

Cast on 63(65)69(71)75(77) sts on needles US 10 ½/UK 2 and start by knitting 16 rows in fisherman's rib. Then continue in pattern. Work straight, until the sleeve measures 48(48)49(49)50(50) cm and fasten off all sts loosely. Knit the other sleeve matching.

Neckband.

With short circular needles US 8/UK 6 knit 72(76)76(80) 80(84) sts up along the neckline incl. The waiting sts. Knit around in ribbing (alternately knit 1 and purl 1, and adapt it to the sts division in the middle off the neckline on front and back piece). When you have knitted 16 rnds, fasten off loosely in ribbing.
